

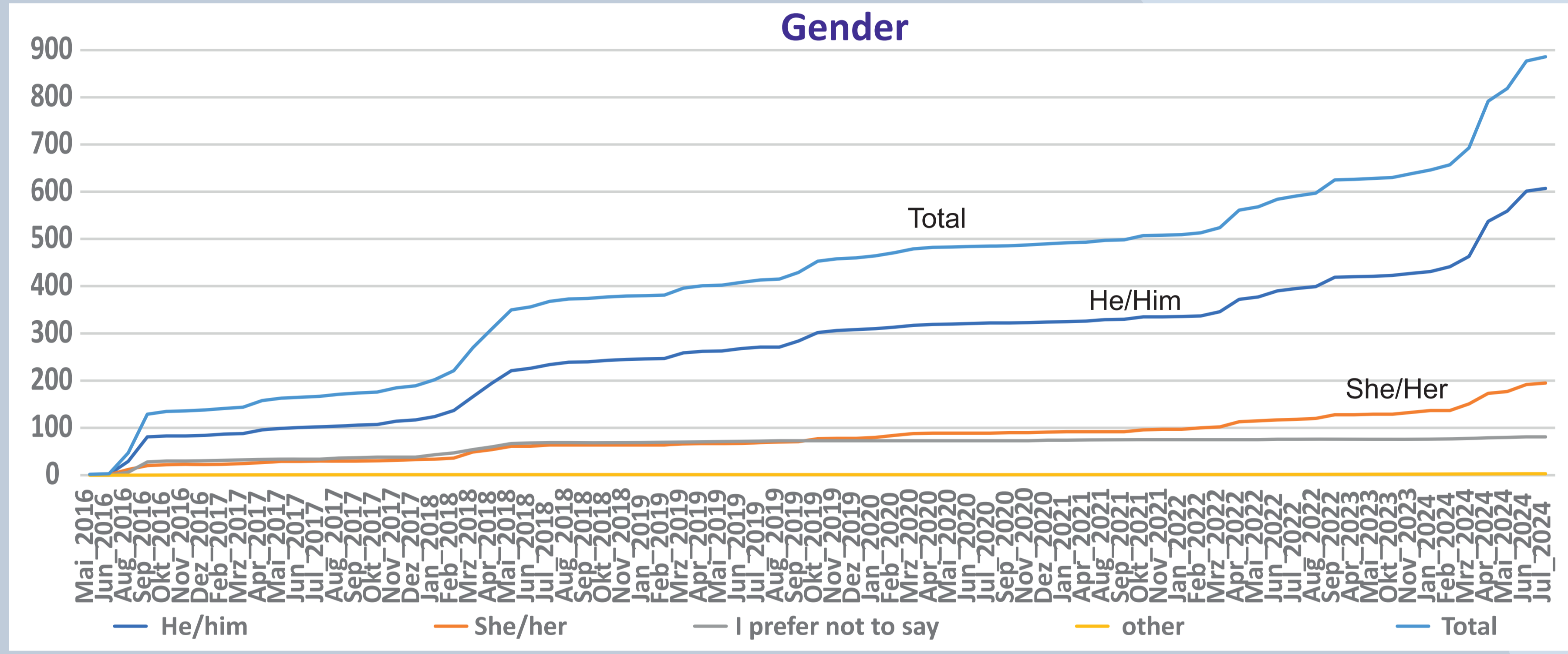
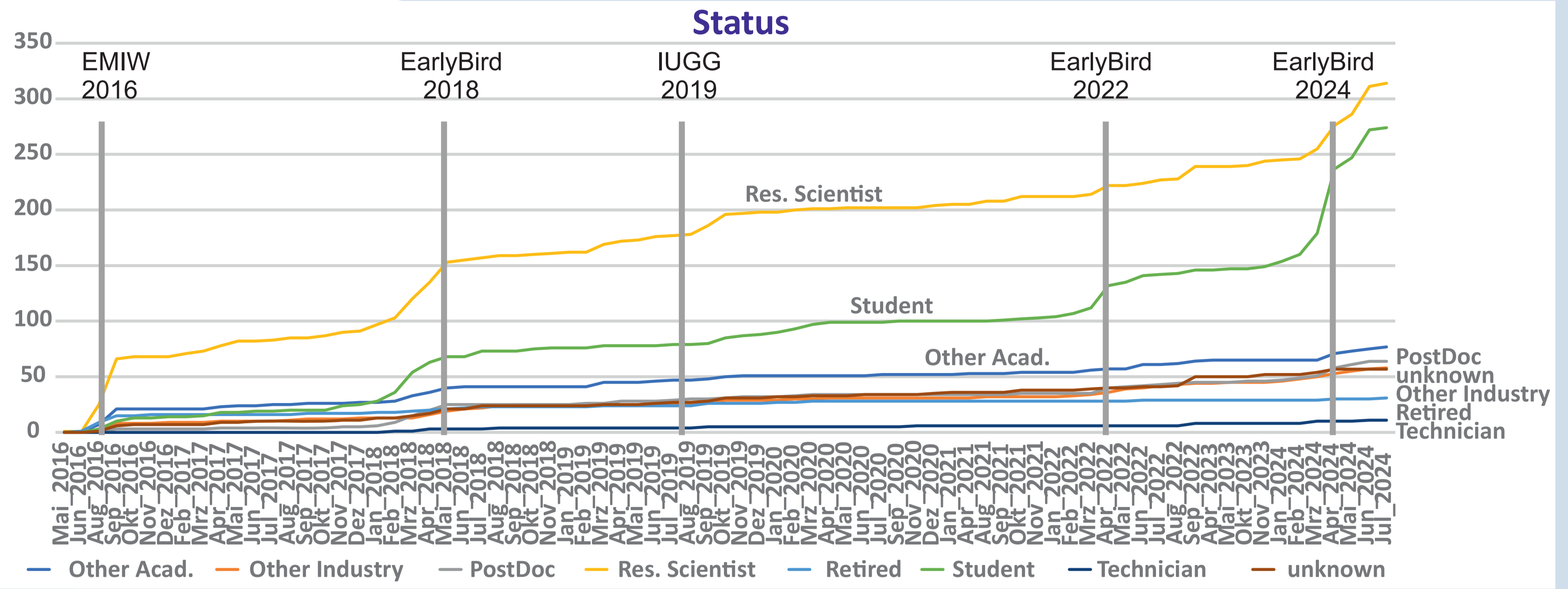
IAGA Division VI at a glance

Since 2016, IAGA Division VI (formerly IAGA WG II.1) has its own website (www.emiw.org) with the possibility to register as a member of our division. This membership database serves as the backbone of our mailing list and the entire registration process for our biennial Electromagnetic Induction Workshops. We currently have over 800 members from nearly 60 countries.

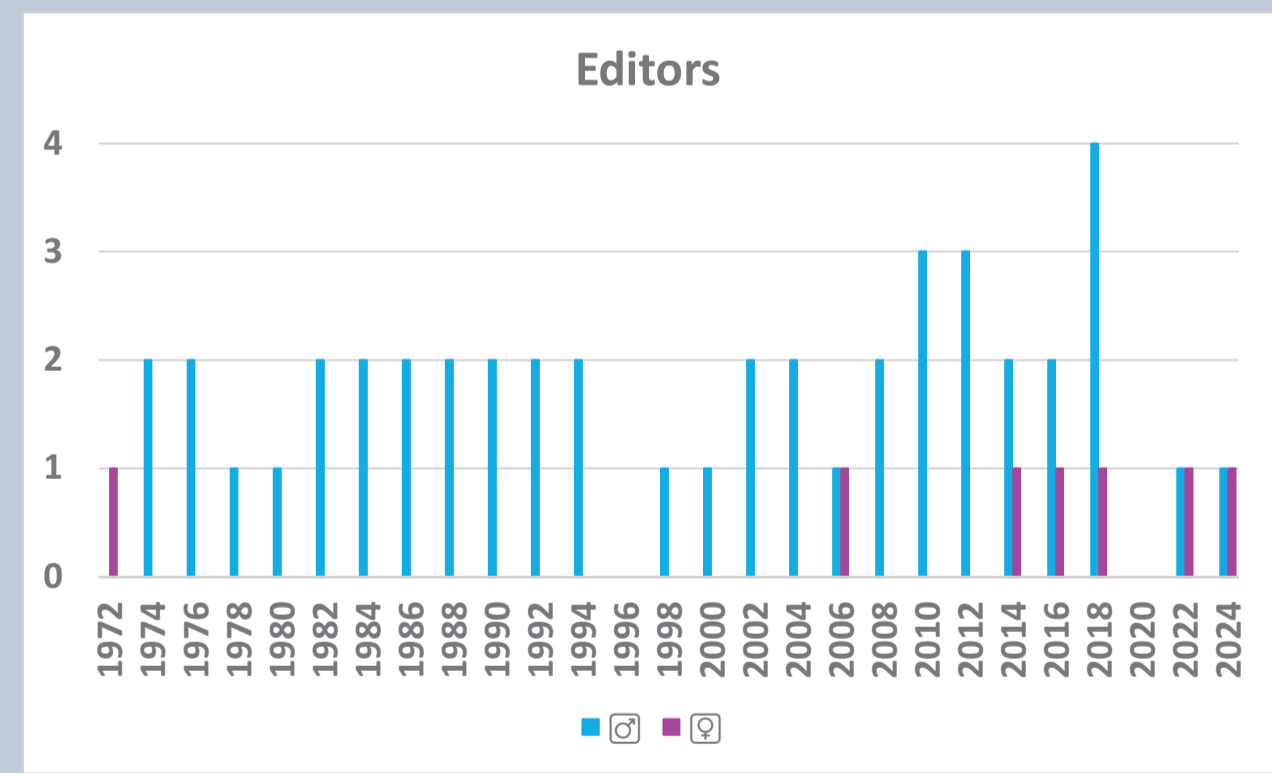

The directory as of 6 Aug 2024 lists 883 members from 59 countries

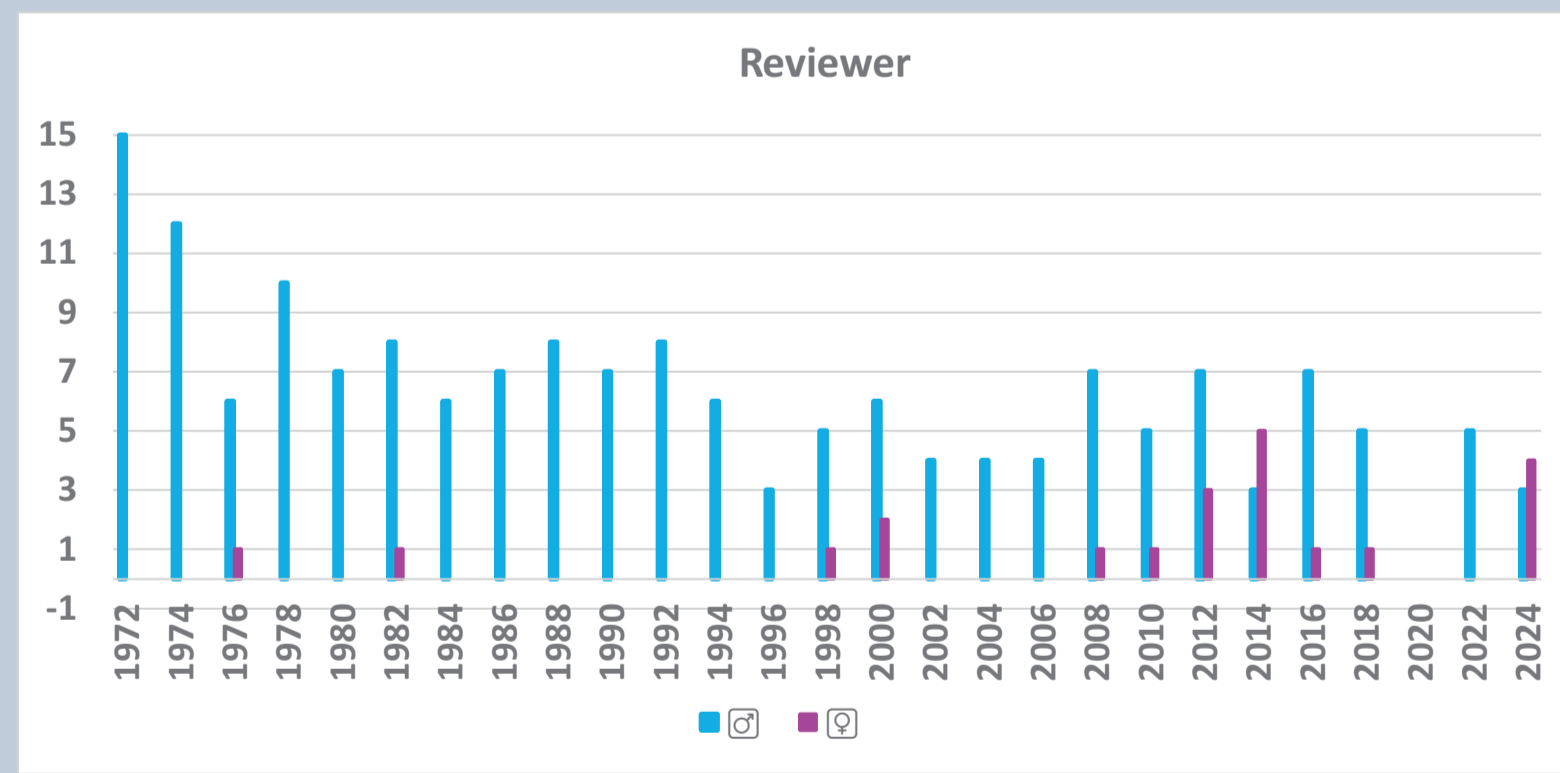


68.8% of our members identify themselves as male (pronoun he/him), and 21.8% as female (she/her). About 9% of the Division members prefer "not to say". This number used to be the default gender status when registering to the Division and it is possible that many of the delegates never changed this in their profiles.

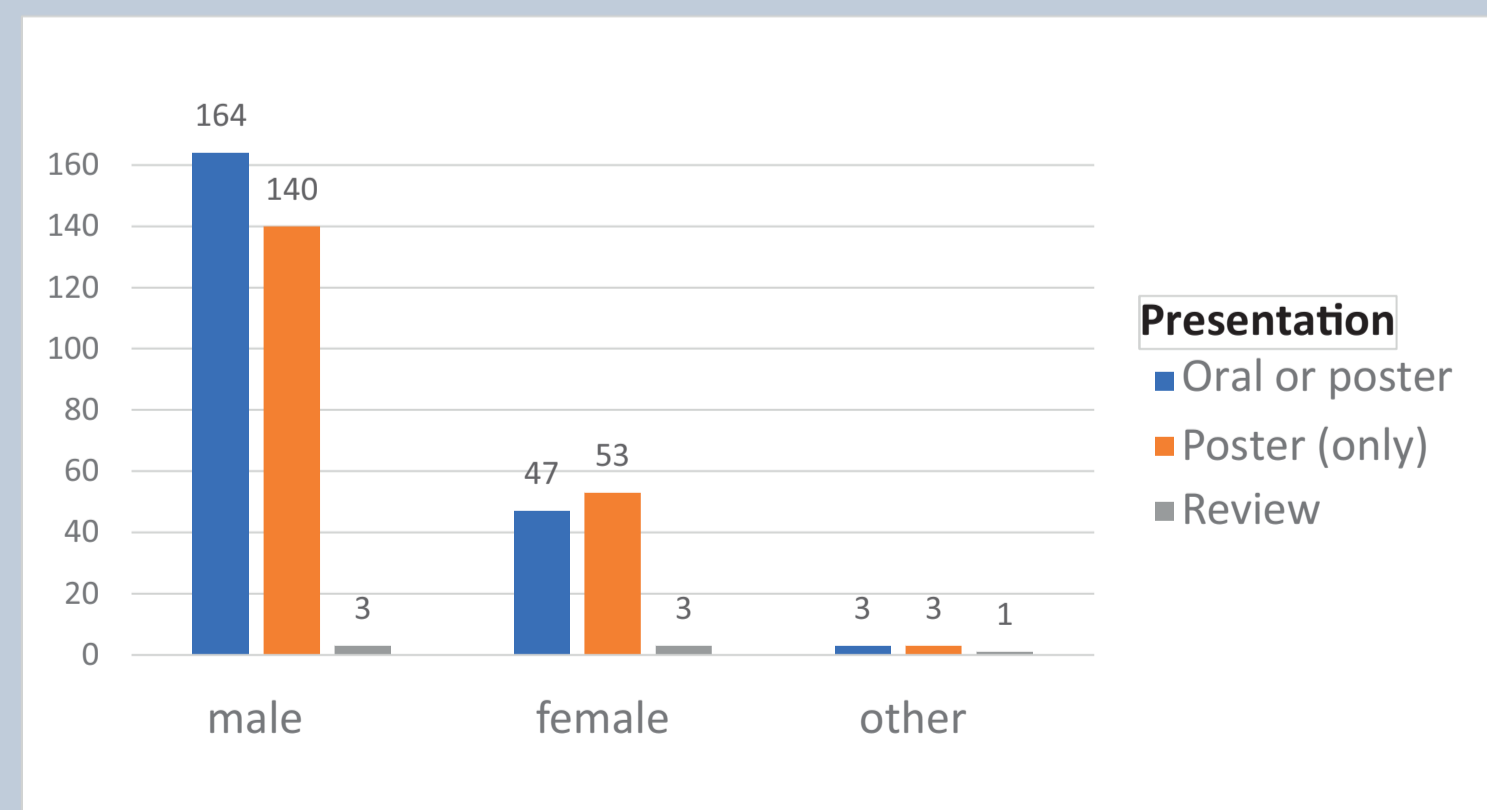
In addition to the scientific aspects, the Committees of our Division must also consider gender equality when allocating scientific contributions or functions



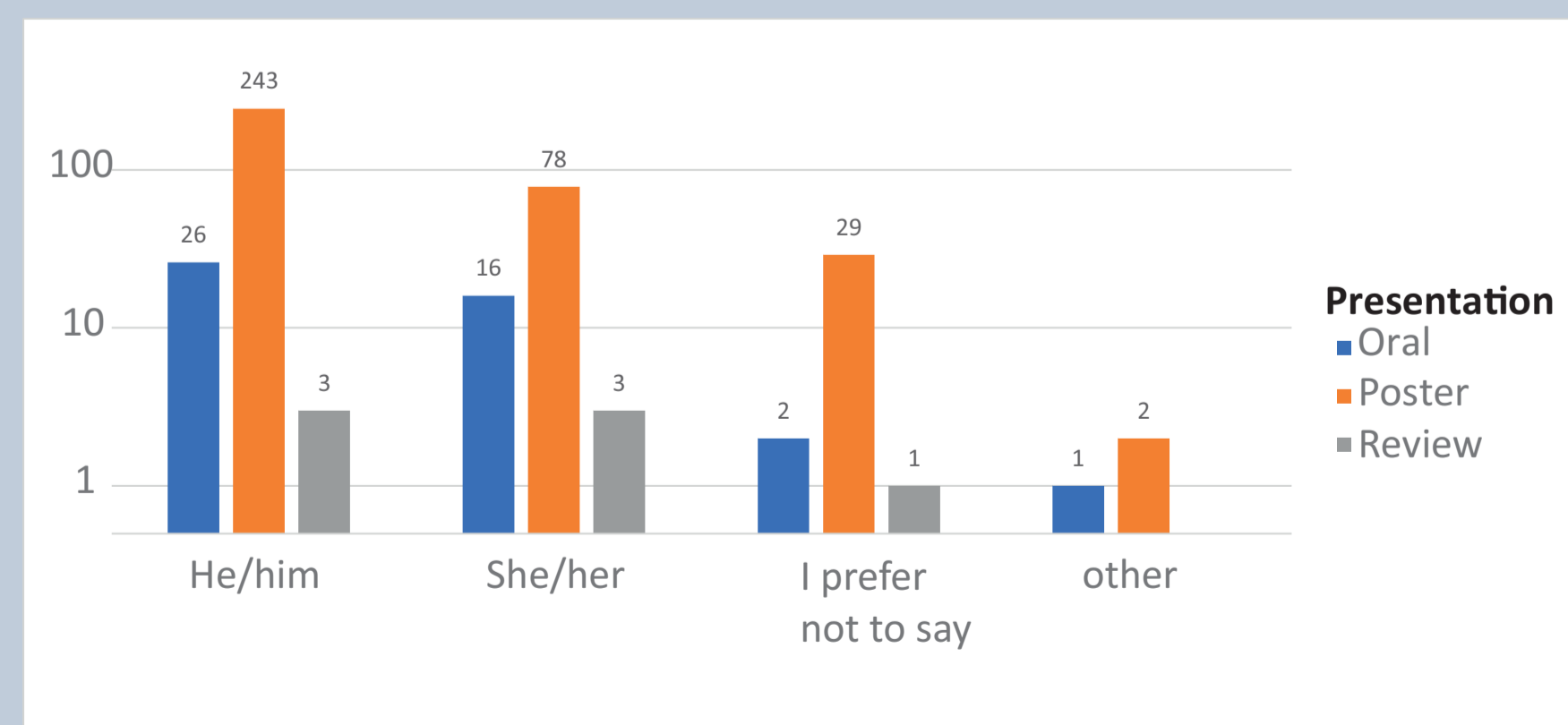
Gender of editors of the Special Issues published after the EMIW workshops

Gender of accepted abstracts at EMIW2024

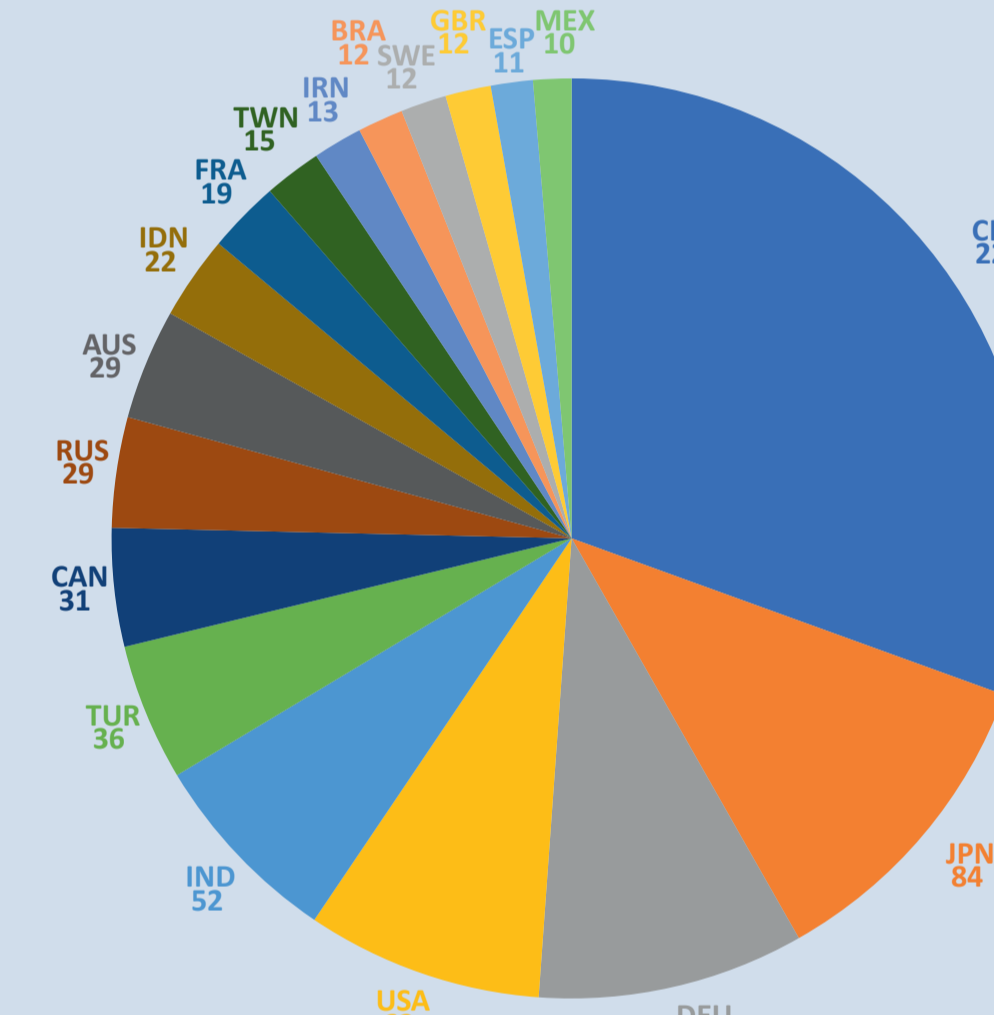


Gender breakdown for each presentation type (submitted abstracts for EMIW2024)

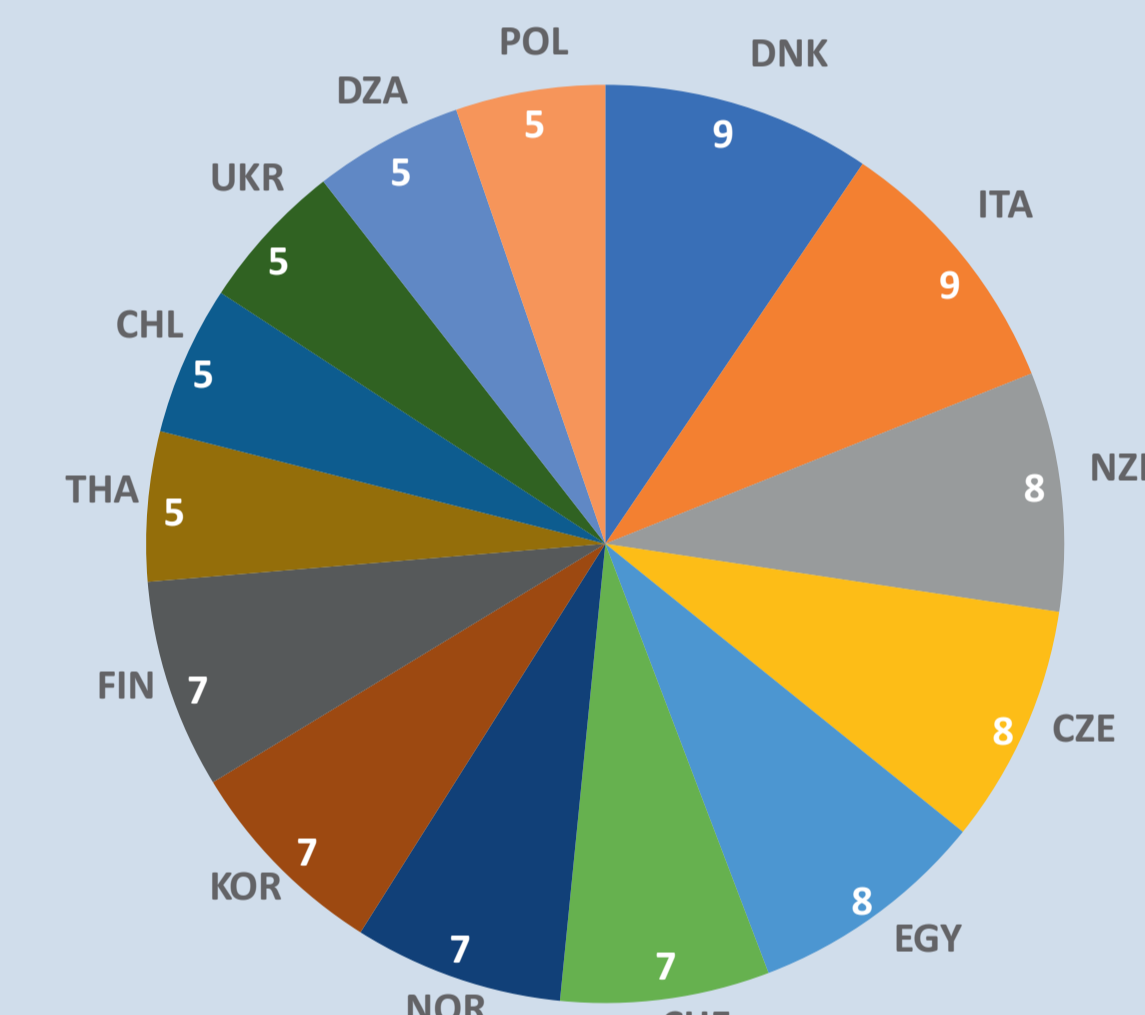
Geographical Representation

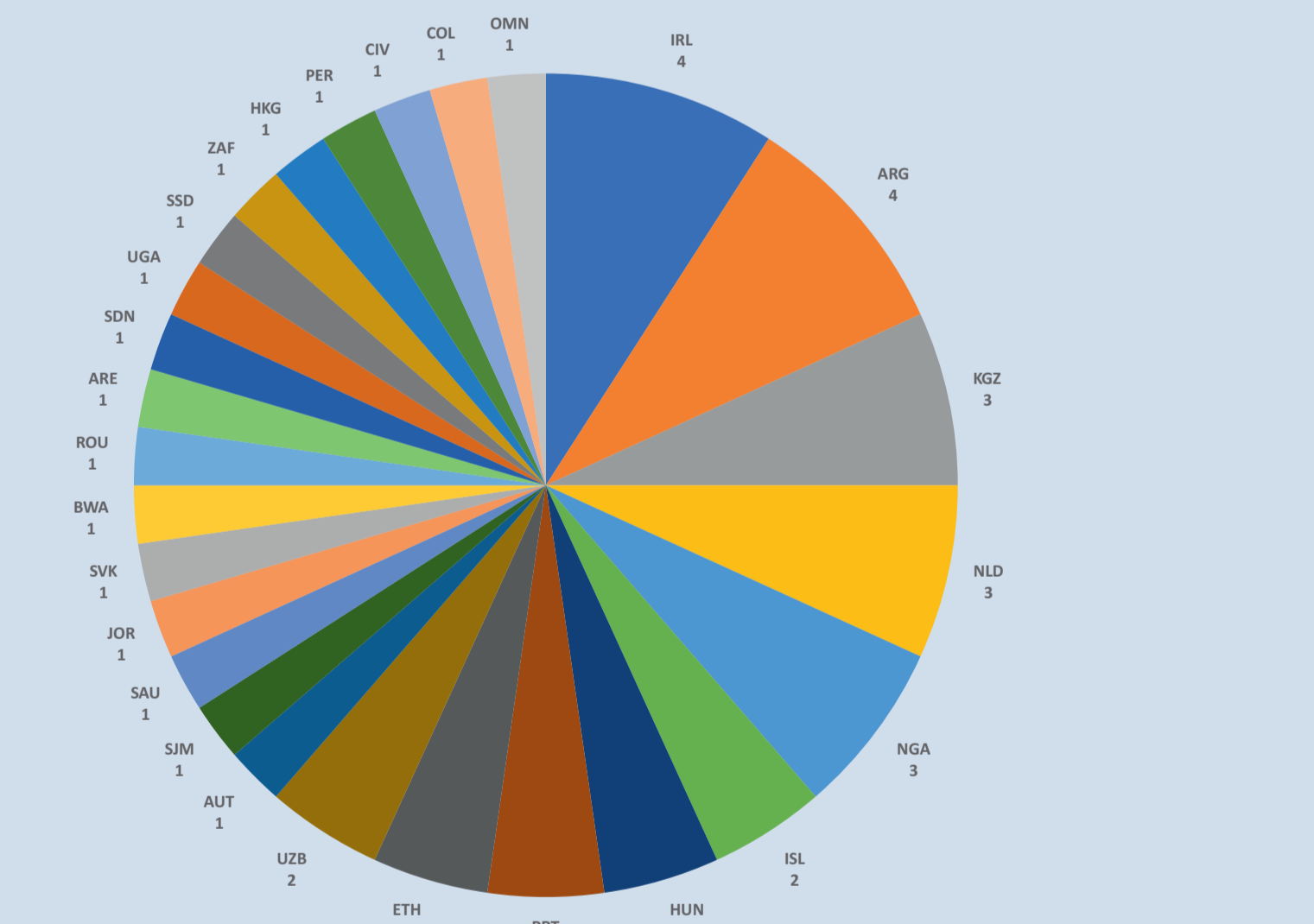
10 or more members



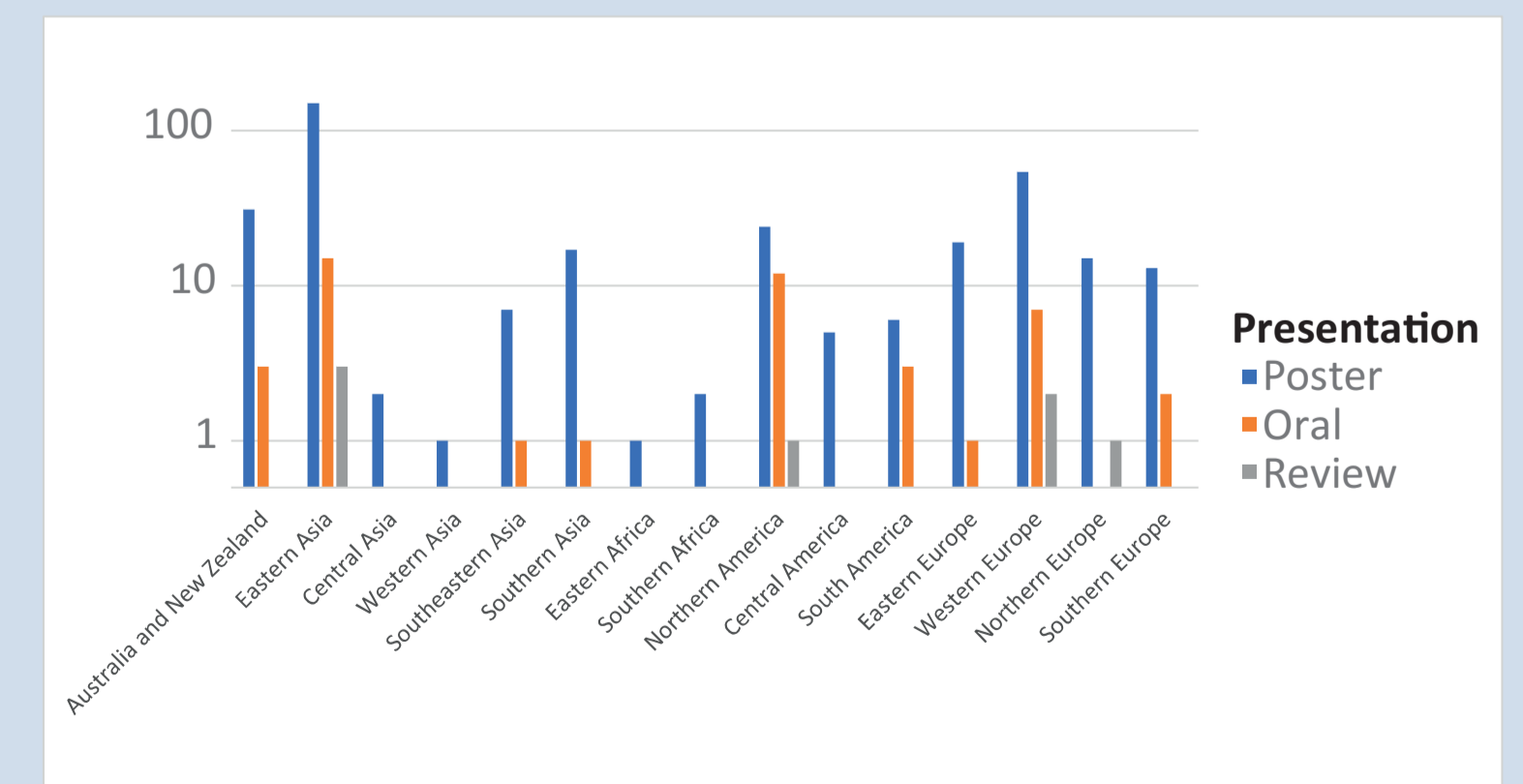
5 - 9 members



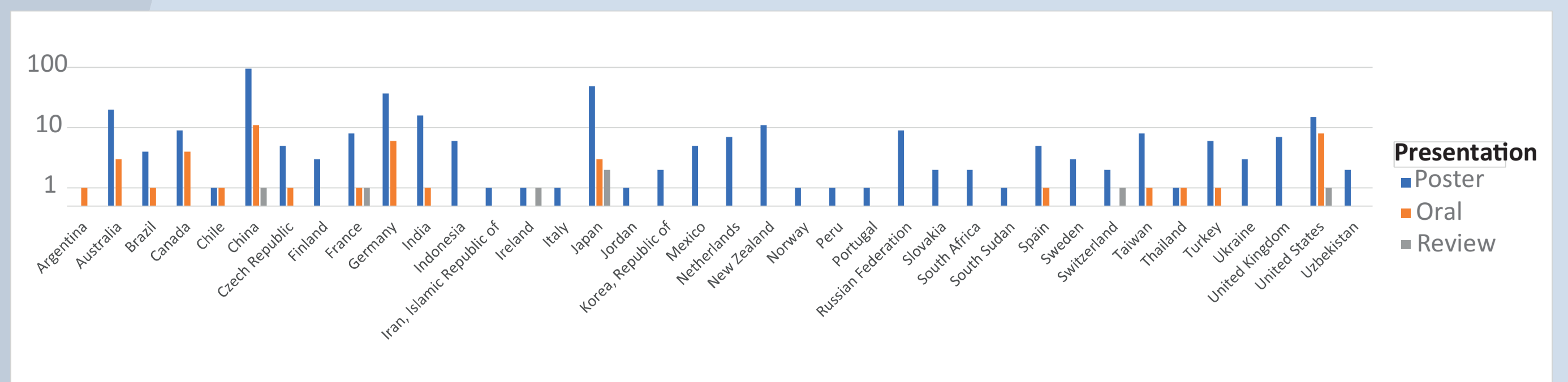
